Each session will focus on a key theme, with Aboriginal and/or non-Aboriginal guest speakers/facilitators sharing at each workshop followed by group discussion based on theme and pre-workshop reading/viewing (short articles or video clips).

Situating the Self - making the invisible visible

Identify and understand Anglo Celt/white racial and cultural identity, **Denise Rundle** the impact of white power on the lived experiences on Aboriginal and Zenadth Kes People; and our role in maintaining and dismantling this power personally and systemically

Uncovering Colonial Concepts of Aboriginal and Zenadth Kes Islander People

Developing a shared understanding of how the racism of colonisation shapes mainstream Australian culture

Racial Literacy Unravelling the story of race in Australia and in our own lives

Situating Aboriginal and Zenadth Kes communities around power and self-determination

Understand how Aboriginal and Zenadth Kes community's power and self-determination has been and is shaped by both the dominant white culture and the activism of Aboriginal and Zendath Kes communities

Effective Allyship Understand what effective allyship is and its practice

Philosophy into Action

Learn how to move from anti-racism analysis to personal and systemic action, and understand the complex journey of sustained and effective anti-racism action
